

Learn about the species harvested in local waters, fishing methods like purse seining and long-lining, marine trade zones, and vessel types. Then continue to the docks to meet some local fishing families and see their boats! Tours last about 45 minutes and start at 10:30am, 11:30am, 1:30pm, and 2:30pm
