Good to Go Meat Pies with locations in Lynden and Everson, WA is leading the charge for implementing Toward Zero Waste practices for businesses located in rural communities. In addition to having two brick and mortar locations they also operate their two farmer market stands with the same principles in mind. It is no small feat to operate locations with varying constraints because of different waste haulers and policies. In one location, they are able to get composting service weekly and recycling is collected in one bin containing plastic, tin, glass, and aluminum. The other location requires glass to be separated by color and from other recyclables. This increases their labor costs, but it is offset by the reduction in waste costs and they are able to break even. Despite the extra challenges, they are successful in their waste reduction efforts and are star performers in the Toward Zero Waste program.
